

Declaration of emancipation, 1848

Commentary field

On July 3, 1848, slavery was abolished in the Danish West Indies. Abolition was the result of a successful slave revolt in St. Croix where thousands of slaves gathered in the town of Frederiksted to demand their freedom. Evidence from the following court martial points to the leadership of among others Martin King and Gotlieb Bordeaux, also known as General Buddoe. Abolition had seemingly been set on a peaceful track in the Danish West Indies. Since the 1830s, Governor General Peter von Scholten had carried through a series of ameliorative measures and in 1847, a royal edict declared that all slaves were to be freed by 1859, except newborns who were to be free immediately. But the enslaved on St. Croix were not satisfied with gradual emancipation and staged a rebellion to gain their freedom. As a response, and presumably to avoid bloodshed, von Scholten declared to the assembled slaves that they were emancipated. In contrast to other late Caribbean rebellions that were very violent, Danish West Indian slaves gained their freedom with relative peace. This was presumably due to a number of conditions, such as the British emancipation of 1838, the French degree of emancipation from April 1848, the Danish edict of 1859, and the personal engagement of Governor von Scholten and General Buddoe who both appear to have strived for a peaceful solution. The declaration of emancipation was subsequently sanctioned by royal decree in December 1848.


